This is to acknowledge receipt of your letter dated January 11, 2001, and your Motion to Withdraw as Attorneys for Debtor.

I am presently in the process of preparing a Statement or Memorandum in answer to this motion and, consequently, have some questions about the process:


1. I note that the Memorandum must be filed no later than 18 days prior to the Hearing Date of February 21, 2001. As I am currently in Kentucky caring for my mother, I will find it very difficult to file this Memorandum in person with the Court. Is it permissible to make this filing with the Court by U.S. Mail and, if so, would you please provide me with their mailing address? And if filing by mail, will the Court accept the postmark date for the 18-day requirement, or is it the date that they receive it?
2. Is there a required format to follow for the Statement or Memorandum, or will a letter addressed to the Court be sufficient?
3. If I am opposing the Motion to Withdraw, must I appear in person at the Court on February 21<sup>st</sup>, or can the process be handled by phone, or, is some other procedure possible?

4. My wife, Theresa, strongly shares your opinion and has very deep concerns about pursuing this matter. She, therefore, does not wish to have any further involvement. Is there a way in which to request this in my Memorandum?
5. If the Court does allow your Motion to Withdraw, or if I do not to oppose the motion, would I then be able to correspond directly with Steve Guttman or Mary Lou Woo (or Gayle Lau and Curtis Ching) regarding the questions of possible improprieties that I have previously presented to you (or which may later arise)?
6. I note on the Certificate of Service that Mary Lou Woo is now listed as the "interim trustee" and Gayle Lau and Curtis Ching are listed as "Office of the US Trustee". Could you please explain how this works? At some point will Ms. Woo's responsibilities be transferred over to the Office of US Trustee? If so, at what date does this occur?

Because of the closeness of the due date for my Memorandum to the Court, I would appreciate your response by fax to (859) 336-3652, if possible. The original can be sent by U.S. Mail.

Again, I apologize for all the extra work I've caused you.
